NS Power is planning to convert the old Power Plant (now a movie studio) on Water Street in Halifax into their main office. A big ironwork job! The 176,000 sq ft sports facility in Halifax will start this Spring, 1000 tons of steel.

Tenders are out on work at the Sydney Tar Ponds; this is a multi-million dollar project unique to our area as this is a contaminated site.

Our contractors are "busy preparing tenders"; they advise that the first 6 months look good!

Infrastructure from the Federal Government will build and repair many bridges, water treatment facilities, sewage treatment facilities and hockey rinks. We should see these projects by Summer and thru 2010.

Although the West is slowing down, we expect there will continue to be work for many of our members as they have developed a good reputation. Despite the economic outlook, we shall do well this year.
